World Health Organization clinical (TNM) staging of TCC of urinary bladder tumors in dogs.¹⁹

Category	Description
T (primary tumor)	
Tis	Carcinoma in situ
T0	No evidence of tumor
T1	Superficial papillary tumor
T2	Tumor invading the urinary bladder wall with induration
T3	Tumor invading neighboring organs
N (RLN)	
N0	No evidence of RLN involvement
N1	RLN involved
N2	RLN and juxtaregional lymph node involved
M (distant metastasis)	
M0	No evidence of distant metastasis
M1	Distant metastasis detected

RLN = Regional lymph node.



Correction: Extralabel use of cabergoline in the treatment of a pituitary adenoma in a rat

In the article “Extralabel use of cabergoline in the treatment of a pituitary adenoma in a rat” (*JAVMA* 2011;239:656–660), a greater than symbol was inadvertently changed to a less than symbol. The correct sentence on page 659 of the Discussion section (left column, beginning on line 6 of the second full paragraph) should read, “A hemorrhagic appearance of the pituitary gland is frequently seen in rats with large spontaneous tumors that are > 10 mm in diameter.”^{1,5,7,27*}
